- 2 million people living with sight loss
- Cuts especially hitting people with SL
- Need for an evidence base to:
  - resist cuts
  - influence commissioning
  - inform service delivery
- Limited time/ skills in workforce
- But, the big SL orgs funding research

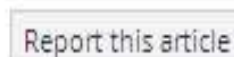

### **Learning from regional workshops**

- Advertising through prof's own networks, personal contacts.
- Community venues
- Coherent structure
- Plan, test & adapt
- Interaction & demonstration
- Accessible presentations



## **Knowledge Exchange Network for the Sight Loss Sector**

- 95% rated workshops 'Good' or 'Excellent'
- 80% agreed workshop had direct application to their job
- 70% have gone on to use at least one learning point or tool
- 79% agree tools and learning have had a major impact on work
- Key areas of impact: Education, Advocacy, Informing and evidencing work
- Practical application:
  - Written and verbal communication
  - Meaningful reflection on service delivery
  - Understanding how to access and use good quality research
- Future commitment to accessible reporting and dissemination



## **Knowledge Exchange Network for the Sight Loss Sector**

“I’ve realised it’s important to gather evidence of your intervention as you go along, build your aims into the service design at the beginning – so I’ve redesigned evaluation forms to reflect this and we’ve designed a beneficiary survey to do at the beginning and the end of the programme. 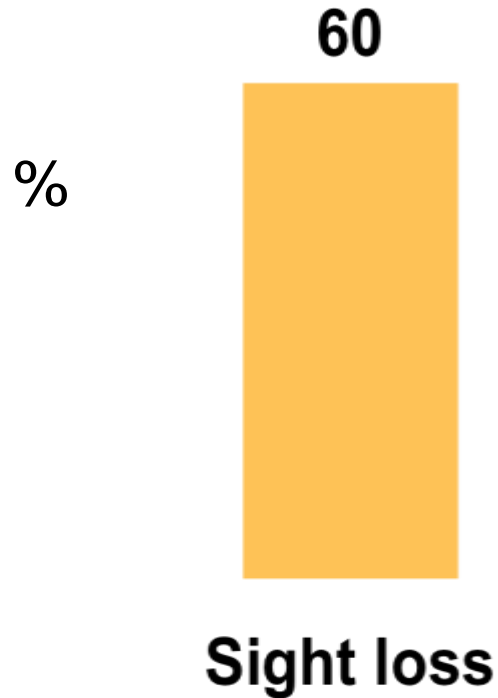


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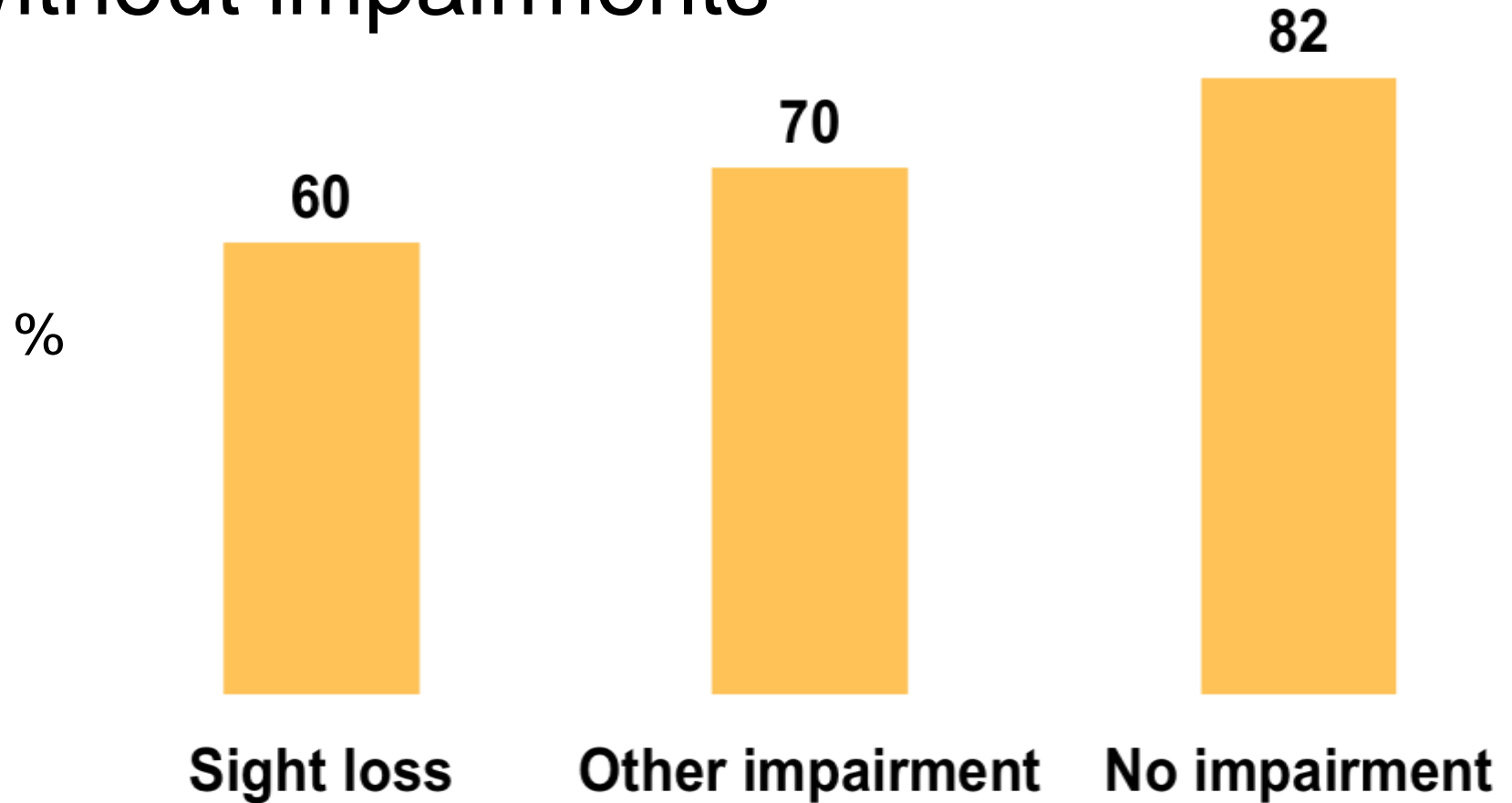

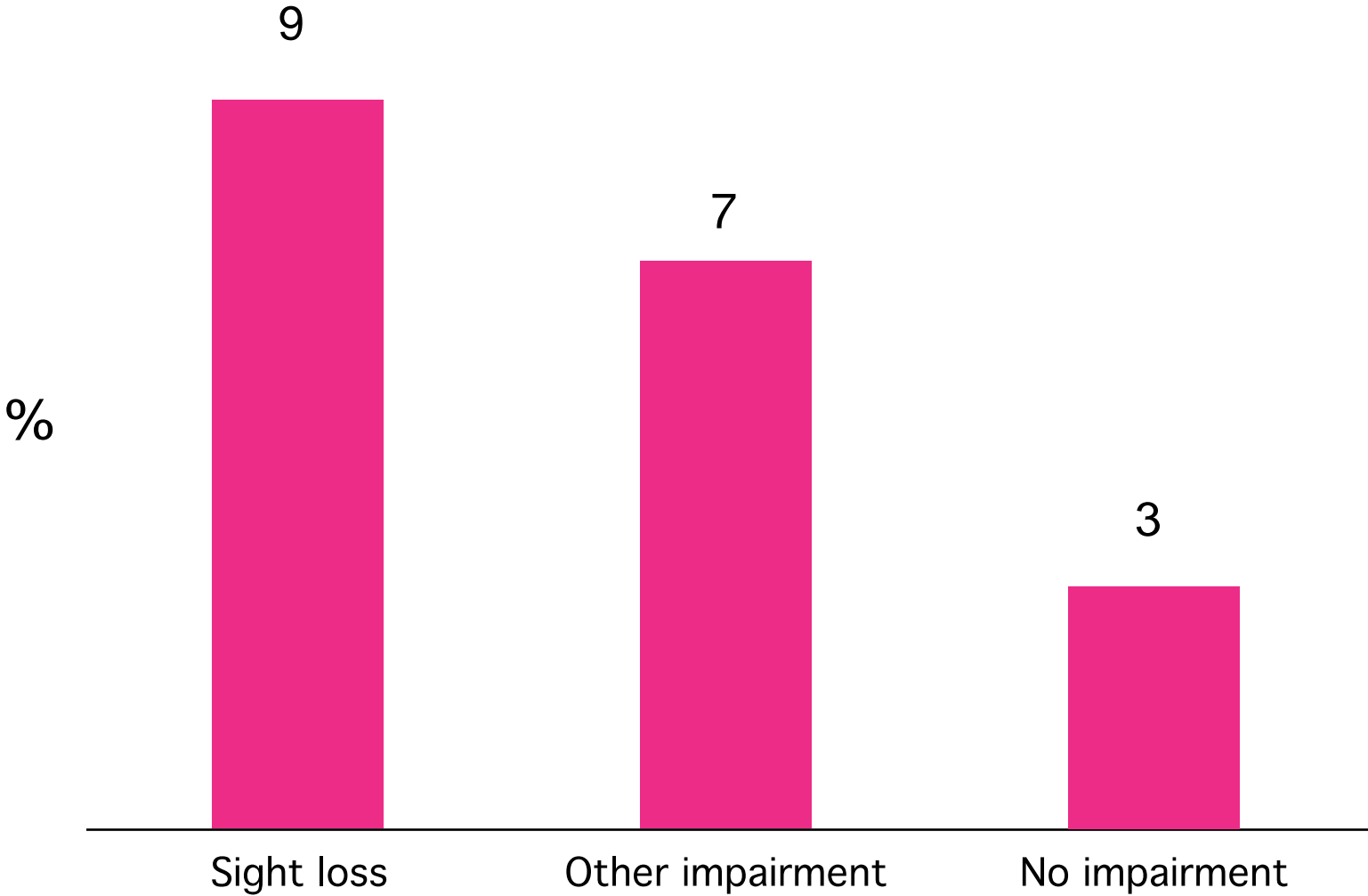
# 60% of people with sight loss report 'high life satisfaction'



People with sight loss **less likely** to have high life satisfaction than those without impairments

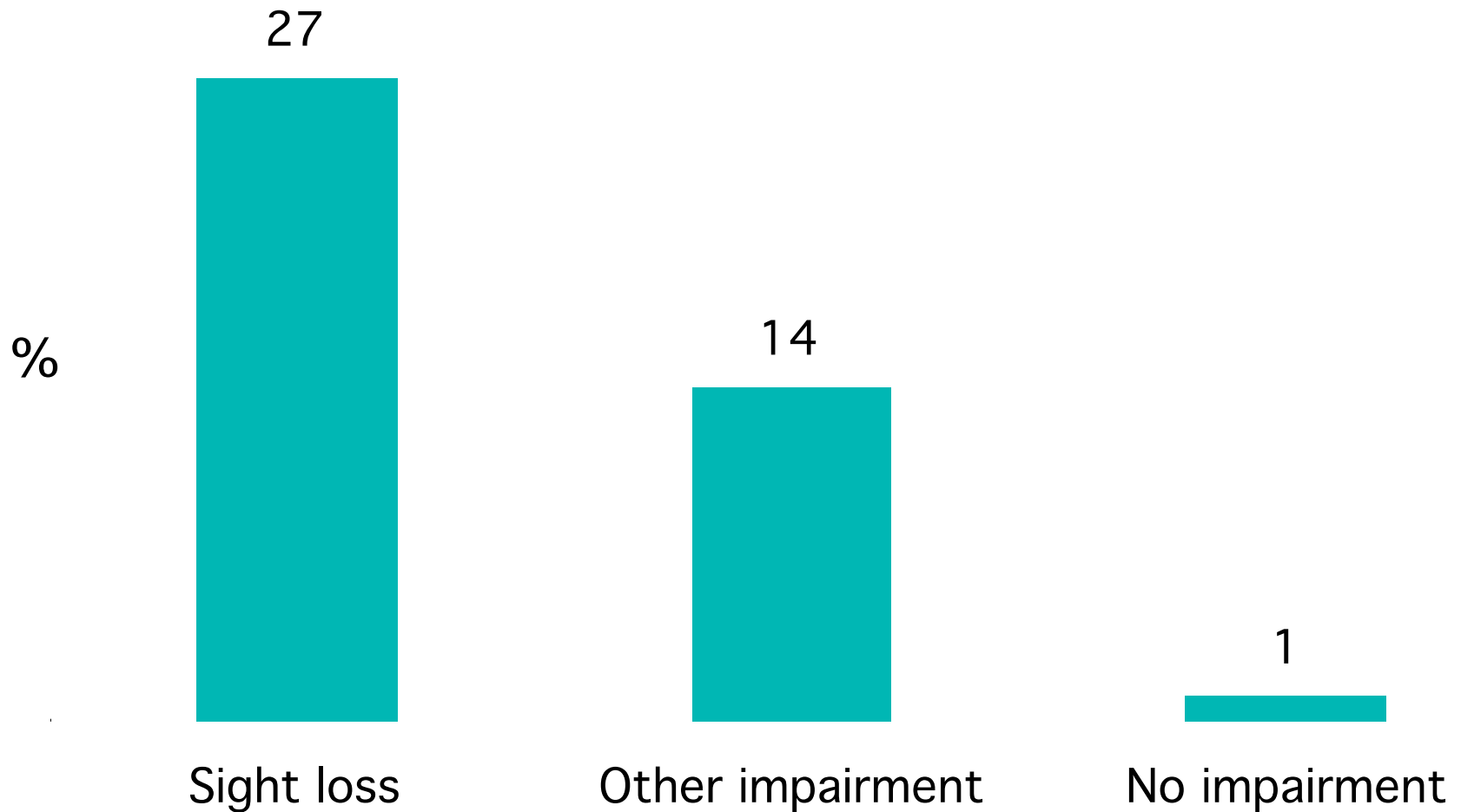


# A lot of difficulty accessing health services
