This course will help you to develop your skills in ethical thinking and ethical decision-making. It will equip you with tools and resources to prepare you to handle the myriad dilemmas you will encounter in your research practice.

The first half of this full day seminar on ***Ethical Thinking and Decision Making in Practice*** addresses the links between research ethics and individual, social, professional, institutional and political ethics, and then focuses on ethics at each stage of the research process.

The second half of the day in contrast will involve real-world case studies and discussions of delegates' own past or present ethical dilemmas.

The seminar will be participative and grounded in practical application, using genuine case studies to allow participants to apply and critique their learning.

By the end of the seminar participants will be familiar with:

- The links between research ethics and other forms of ethics
- Ethical aspects of research at all stages of the research process, from the initial idea to the last piece of dissemination – and beyond
- What is ethical, questionable, and unethical in real-world research in practice
- Different moral standpoints, and the difference they make to ethical thinking and decision-making
